Main Objective	To acknowledge, grant and support the NB-DSS users for growing applications, and profound contribution to Nile Basin Water Resources Management; document and promote DSS use and applicability as well as strengthen the NB-DSS user community.
Eligibility Conditions	All residents of the Nile Basin countries can apply. The award can be granted to individuals as well as groups.
Maximum Number of Applications	No limits are set in terms of the number of national and transboundary DSS application cases submitted for the award. The Nile Secretariat will select the best one and advise the applicants. DSS cases that are not running for the award will be also recognized, documented, and published.
NB-DSS Best Application Award: the process	 15 October 2016: the applicants should submit an extended abstract of 5 pages that contains a full description of the DSS application. Description given should concisely cover the background information, location and particulars of the site, problem definition, assumptions made, datasets used, methodology and scope, modeling results, interpretation and outputs. 30 November 2016: short-listed submissions will be notified and required to submit full DSS application documentation 31 Jan 2017: shortlisted candidates submit full documentation includes a technical report (about 15 – 20 Pages), the DSS database backup (with models, data, results) 31 March 2017: best 3 applications are announced Top three candidates may be requested to give presentation on their application in a regional workshop of DSS uses. The top three (3) applications will receive the categorical award during the workshop. NBI will cover the necessary costs. Full list of applications submitted will be compiled and disseminated.
Criteria for Evaluation	 The DSS application is carried out by the expert or group of experts; i.e. no consultant or advisor was involved. The application is real-life case.
